IMPORTANT NOTES:

ALLIED HEALTH AND NURSING PROGRAMS REQUIRE FORMAL PROGRAM ADMISSIONS AND APPROVAL FROM THE DEPARTMENT.

NOTE 1: These courses are required. towards the completion of an AAS in Nursing Degree. The Nursing Program recommends the courses be completed prior to nursing coursework; however, they may be taken in conjunction with Nursing coursework.

NOTE 2: The Nursing Program at Kellogg Community College offers an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing. The Advanced Placement Nursing program is for students who already hold an LPN license in the State of Michigan and wish to complete the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing to be eligible to take the NCLEX-RN licensure exam and become an RN. Refer to the Kellogg Community College Academic Catalog for more information.

NOTE 3: All Nursing coursework, and general education courses, must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher to progress in the program and meet graduation requirements.

NOTE 4: Students formally accepted to participate in Allied Health, Emergency Medical Services, or Nursing programs are required to comply with clinical access requirements prior to, and potentially during clinical education placement in a hospital, outpatient clinic, or other clinical education providers. The Program’s Director or Coordinator will provide students with detailed direction and timeline for completing all clinical access requirements. Students are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen, and criminal background check.
