Kellogg Community College's Radiography Program consists of classroom lecture and supervised clinical experience. The program's extensive clinical experiences require the time commitment of a full-time student. Successful completion of the program leads to eligibility to take the national certification examination of American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.

This is a competitive point-based admission process. Points are awarded for grades in coursework, ACT/SAT scores and degrees earned.

All students **must** complete a KCC General Application and have met **all** admissions requirements prior to applying to the RADI program.

REQUIRED RADI COURSEWORK PREREQUISITES

The following courses must be completed prior to admission to the Radiography program.

All courses must be completed with a grade of a C (2.0) or better.

- *ALHE 227 2 credits Medical Terminology
- *BIOL 201 4 credits Human Anatomy
- *BIOL 202 4 credits Human Physiology
- PSYC 201 3 credits Introduction to Psychology
- *ENGL 151 3 credits Freshman Composition
or *ENGL 152
- *MATH 102 4 credits Practical Algebra (or higher math level course)
- † NURS 105 3 credits Nursing Assistant Training
(or current State Certification as a Nursing Assistant)
- *POSC 201 3 credits American Government
or *SOC 201 3 credits Introduction to Sociology

† NURS 105 must be successfully completed at KCC within two years prior to the program application deadline date, or a current State of Michigan Nursing Assistant Certification will be accepted in lieu of the NURS 105 course.

Applicants for the Radiography Program are admitted to the program through a competitive points and ranking system. Points are awarded for academic achievement with applicants ranked accordingly.

- Grades of A or A- earn 10 points for first attempt, 8 points for second attempt
- Grades of B+, B or B- earn 7 points for first attempt, 5 points for second attempt


SECTION B – ACT/SAT Composite Score or College Degree

A composite of 13 – 25 will earn points equal to the composite score. A composite of 26 – 36 will earn 25 points.

NOTE: No points are awarded for an ACT composite score of 12 or below. SAT composite scores will be converted to assign points.

- Bachelor’s Degree — 24 points
- Associate’s Degree — 20 points

All degrees must be from an accredited college or university. Only the highest degree will be counted (i.e. if you have an AAS and BA, only the BA counts).

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Future employers may require a proof of high school or GED completion as an employment requirement.
- Meet early and often with an Academic Advisor after completing KCC's General Application and submitting college transcripts and ACT/SAT scores, but prior to submitting the RADJ application, to review course specific requirements and transfer equivalencies.
- Transfer transcripts should be on file and evaluated by KCC's Registrar's office before meeting with an Academic Advisor to get the most out of your appointment. Please note that it can take a maximum of two weeks for in-state transcripts and four weeks for out-of-state transcripts to be evaluated.
- Although ACT/SAT scores are not an admission requirement for the Radiography program, please note that, in lieu of a college degree with a 2.5 GPA or higher, points are awarded for ACT/SAT composite scores of 13 and higher (see Section B of the points sheet).
- Students accepted into the RADJ program are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen, and a criminal background check. Individuals may obtain a preliminary determination from the state of Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) concerning whether any court judgments against him or her would likely result in a denial of a license.
