ARP Act: Emergency Funds for Eligible Students

Who is eligible?

In order to be eligible to be considered to receive funds, KCC students:

- Must have been enrolled in credit bearing courses for the Spring 2022 semester as of March 7, 2022
- Must have incurred expenses related to higher education or emergency costs associated with the Coronavirus pandemic
- Must not have educational costs fully covered by an outside sponsorship or high school

In accordance with Department of Education guidelines, KCC will distribute ARPA emergency grant funding for 2022 fall eligible students in the following manner:

- Pell Grant, Michigan Futures for Frontliners, and/or Michigan Reconnect Scholarship recipients enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$1,550. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$775.
- Other grant, scholarship and/or loan recipients not receiving a Pell, Futures for Frontliners and/or Michigan Reconnect scholarship enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$1,020. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$510.
- Students without additional financial assistance awarded to their account enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$800. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$400.
- Dual enrolled and Sponsored students will not be receiving automatic grants under this round of emergency awards due to the low response rate from previous semesters.
- Unless an electronic HEERF Consent Authorization has been submitted through the Bruin portal, all emergency grant funds will be processed through student accounts and will be transferred via direct deposit or, if the student does not have banking information on file, via paper check and mailed to the student.
- Those student's submitting an electronic HEERF Consent Authorization will have their emergency grant processed according to their selected prioritization as a payment on their student account first with any over-award being refunded as outlined above.
- Automatic grants are scheduled to be issued to students the week of March 18, 2022.

This distribution of emergency grants will fully exhaust the stimulus funding received by Kellogg Community College under the ARPA program. No additional grants will be issued in future semesters.
