## CRRSA Act: Emergency Funds for Eligible Students

### Who is eligible?

In order to be eligible to be considered to receive funds, KCC students:

- Must have been a degree or certificate seeking student enrolled in the Spring 2021 semester as of February 8, 2021
- Must have incurred expenses related to higher education or emergency costs associated with the Coronavirus pandemic
- Must be an eligible US citizen

In accordance with Department of Education guidelines, KCC will distribute CRRSA Act emergency grant funding for eligible students in the following manner:

- Pell Grant and/or Michigan Futures for Frontliners Scholarship recipients enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$650. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$325.
- Other grant, scholarship and/or loan recipients not receiving a Pell or Futures for Frontliners scholarship enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$200. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$100.
- Students without additional financial assistance awarded to their account enrolled in 12 or more credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$100. Those enrolled in less than 12 credit hours will receive automatic grants of \$50.
- Dual enrolled and Sponsored students will receive automatic grants of \$50.
- All emergency grant funds will be processed through student accounts and will be transferred via direct deposit or, if the student does not have banking information on file, via paper check and mailed to the student.

In accordance with Department of Education guidelines, KCC will distribute online fee reimbursements using CRRSA Act funds for all enrolled students in the following manner:

- Online course fees of \$35 per credit hour will be refunded to all students using funding from both the Student Supplemental Grant and the Institutional Supplemental Grant awards. Automatic reimbursements will be processed the week of March 15 and payments will be made directly to the student. For Dual enrolled and Sponsored students, reimbursements will be made directly to the payor on the account.
- Online course fee reimbursements will be transferred via direct deposit or, if the student does not have banking information on file, via paper check and mailed to the student.
