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# Kellogg Community College Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees March 15, 2023

The Kellogg Community College Board of Trustees met in a regular public session on March 15, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. in the Board Room of the Kellogg Community College Roll Administration Building, 450 North Avenue, Battle Creek, MI. A Zoom conferencing option was available to staff and the public.

Chairman Claywell called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

#### ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AGENDA

There were no adjustments to the agenda.

#### **CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES**

The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the minutes from the regular meeting held on February 15, 2023, with a motion from Secretary Byrd and supported by Treasurer Reynolds.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

**Athletic Highlight:** Dr. Paul Watson introduced Mr. Drew Fleming, athletic director, and acknowledged the KCC Basketball teams in attendance. Mr. Fleming shared information about the women's basketball team highlighting Corrin Replogle, who serves with the Michigan National Guard and served to provide security after the Michigan State University incident last month. Mr. Fleming shared information about the men's basketball team and requested that the coaches and players from both teams complete introductions.

**MCCA All-Michigan Academic Team:** Dr. Watson shared that on March 13, 2023, Ms. Tonya Forbes, Mr. Eric Greene, and himself attended the Michigan Community College Association (MCCA) 2023 All-Michigan Academic Team event that recognized three KCC students, Ms. Raylene Bosier, Mr. Brent Runyon, and Ms. Ella Smith. The students have been named to the Michigan Community College Association 2023 All-Michigan Academic Team and are selected based on academic achievement, community service involvement, and leadership accomplishment.

**Governor Whitmer Visit:** Dr. Paul Watson shared that on March 7, 2023, Vice Chair Davis, Secretary Byrd, and several KCC staff were in attendance at the Regional Manufacturing Technology Center (RMTC) to host Governor Gretchen Whitmer for an event focused on her proposed budget and its impact on community colleges, our K12 partners, and support for workforce development. Mr. Romie Mullen, a Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) student did a wonderful job sharing his experiences and introducing the governor.

**Institutional Priorities – Community Engagement Update:** Mr. Eric Greene and Ms. Teresa Durham presented the institutional priorities community engagement update. The report included information about

key performance indicators, work that has been completed, and a plan for moving forward and engaging with the community. Vice Chair Davis asked about gaining information and connections with the community through the Board of Trustee members. Mr. Greene stated that he would follow up with this request. Secretary Byrd asked if KCC staff are incentivized to attend community meetings, not monetarily, but with time to attend meetings throughout the workday. Ms. Durham shared that other companies are incentivizing community engagement, which could be an area to explore.

**Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Council (IPS) Update:** Mr. Brad Fuller and Mr. Greg Colegrove shared project closeouts that were under budget, new requests that have been submitted, and information about items that will be coming to the Board of Trustees for approval in the future.

KCC Foundation Update: Ms. Teresa Durham will share highlights of KCC Foundation events, including the results of the March 3 Bid a Brighter Future Auction and Raffle, where KCC employees raised \$14,727 to support the Beyond Tuition fund and the Bruin Baskets. This makes the total money raised through the Bid a Brighter Future event over \$200,000 in the last 20 years. The KCC/MSU Food Lab Open House will be in mid-April. Ms. Durham hopes the Board of Trustees can tour the mobile lab at the April Board Meeting, depending on the mobile lab arriving on campus by April 19. Lastly, there are 54 Gold Key Scholarship applications, and March 21 is the next Fresh Food Distribution date.

**Scholarships and Grants:** For the month of February, the receipts in external gifts and grants to students was \$4,250 for a 2022/2023 academic year total of \$311,977.21.

#### **BOARD REPORTS AND REQUESTS**

Trustee O'Donnell explained that March is Reading Month. He, and several KCC employees, have been going to area elementary schools with Blaze to read books to students. The elementary students are enjoying the experience and meeting Blaze.

Ms. Eve Hibbard shared an update about student events for the last month and played a video created by the Encore Theatre group.

## CITIZEN/STAFF REQUESTS AND COMMENTS

There were no citizen or staff comments.

### **ACTION ITEMS**

Compliance with the Community College Act, Sec. 389.141: Dr. Paul Watson shared that Michigan law requires the Board of Trustees to estimate the amount of property taxes necessary for the 2024 fiscal year. A resolution has been prepared based on the assumption that it will be necessary for the Board to levy the full voted millage next year. The resolution, included in the Board of Trustees packet, is only a required statutory obligation. It is not an authorization of the budget or millage levy, both of which will come before the Board of Trustees in June. The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the compliance with the Community College Act and resolution with a motion from Vice Chair Davis and supported by Secretary Byrd.

**Tuition and Fee Rates Effective Fall 2023:** Dr. Paul Watson shared a memorandum describing the recommendation for tuition and fee rates for 2023-2024. Please note that the \$3.75 per credit hour increase in rates for residents, along with freezing the Technology and Student Services fees at current levels, is approximately a 2.5% increase, which is less than the governor's proposed 4.5% tuition restraint language, less than what most other community colleges are reporting their tuition and fee increases will be, and well below inflation. Preliminary budget projections make this recommendation a prudent move to keep the College's fiscal health in order.

Chairman Claywell thanked all those involved in ensuring that the tuition increase remains minimal, allowing the College to invest in the community and students. The College's commitment is to the community and remaining affordable while offering high-quality education while remaining fiscally sound. Secretary Byrd

explained that the Board of Trustees took the tuition increase seriously and thanked all those involved in the process. Student Representative Hibbard thanked the Board of Trustees for keeping students in mind and keeping the increase to a minimum. The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the new tuition rate with a motion from Treasurer Reynolds and supported by Trustee McKay.

**OP 16.001 Freedom of Expression Policy:** Dr. Paul Watson shared the Freedom of Expression Policy for approval. The purpose of this policy is to facilitate expressive activities while ensuring that such activities do not interfere with College operations and the learning environment. The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Freedom of Expression Policy with a motion from Trustee Mueller and supported by Trustee McKay.

**OP 18.003 Student Indebtedness Policy:** Dr. Paul Watson shared the Student Indebtedness Policy for approval. This policy that will permit the Finance department some flexibility to work with these students to allow them to register, continue their education, pay down what they owe the College while doing so, and ultimately, see them complete the coursework. The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Student Indebtedness Policy with a motion from Treasurer Reynolds and supported by Trustee McKay.

**Support Staff Union, UAW Local 1294 Unit 25, Tentative Agreement:** Dr. Paul Watson shared the KCC Support Staff tentative contract agreement for the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 fiscal years. The Support Staff Union recently voted and ratified the agreement. Chairman Claywell recognized the union members and administration for working together to create an agreement. The Board of Trustees **unanimously** approved the Support Staff Tentative Agreement with a motion from Secretary Byrd and supported by Vice Chair Davis.

**Financial Statements:** The Board of Trustees unanimously approved the financial statements with a motion from Treasurer Reynolds and supported by Secretary Byrd.
