The PTA program at Kellogg Community College prepares students to provide physical therapy services under the direction and supervision of a licensed physical therapist. The program includes a rigorous curriculum of classroom, lab, and clinical education experiences in physical therapy settings of health care facilities, preparing the student for success on the national licensure exam which is required to work and practice as a PTA in most states.

This is a competitive point-based admission process. Points are awarded for grades in coursework, degrees earned and calculated GPA from **all** accredited colleges/universities attended.

All students **must** complete a KCC General Application and have met **all** admissions requirements prior to applying to the PTA program.

- Meet early and often with an Academic Advisor after completing KCC's General Application and submitting
 college transcripts but prior to submitting the PTA application, to review course specific requirements and transfer
 equivalencies.
- Transfer transcripts should be on file and evaluated by KCC's Registrar's office before meeting with an Academic Advisor to get the most out of your appointment. Please note that it can take a maximum of two weeks for in-state transcripts and four weeks for out-of-state transcripts to be evaluated.
- Students accepted into the PTA program are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen, and a criminal background check. Individuals may obtain a preliminary determination from the state of Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) concerning whether any court judgments against him or her would likely result in a denial of a license.
