### IMPORTANT NOTES:

Students should seek an appointment with an Academic Advisor to determine courses which best meet individual academic goals and to discuss transfer options including verification of courses towards the completion of the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). Students must complete a minimum of 60 credits in approved courses to earn a degree at Kellogg Community College with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. **NOTE 1:** These courses are required towards the completion of an AAS in Nursing Degree. The Nursing Program recommends the courses be completed prior to nursing coursework; however, they may be taken in conjunction with Nursing coursework.

**NOTE 2:** At the mid-point of the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing program, students are eligible to take the practical nurse licensure exam (NCLEX-PN) to become a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). This additional certification is optional, and does not impact the RN program completion. Information about nurse licensure exams is available at <https://www.ncsbn.org/nclex.htm>.

**NOTE 3:** All Nursing coursework, and general education courses, must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher to progress in the program and meet graduation requirements.

**NOTE 4:** Students formally accepted to participate in Allied Health, Emergency Medical Services, or Nursing programs are required to comply with clinical access requirements prior to, and potentially during clinical education placement in a hospital, outpatient clinic, or other clinical education providers. The Program's Director or Coordinator will provide students with detailed direction and timeline for completing all clinical access requirements. Students are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen, and criminal background check.
