Athletic Opportunities

Kellogg Community College (KCC) offered four (4) intercollegiate opportunities for men and five (5) intercollegiate opportunities for women during the 2022-23 academic year. KCC teams compete at the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) level. KCC is a league member of the Michigan Community College Athletic Association (MCCAA) and participates within the Region XII membership area of the NJCAA.

KCC is committed to providing equitable athletic opportunities for men and women, in terms of both the <u>number</u> of opportunities available and the <u>quality</u> of the experience. In 2022-23, women comprised of 62% of KCC's undergraduate enrollment and 51% of our varsity athletes. The KCC Athletic Department conducts regular administrative reviews to ensure continued provision of equitable athletic opportunities.

Operating Expenses

Operating expenses, as defined by the EADA, include uniforms, equipment, officials, transportation, lodging, and meals. Coaching salaries and recruiting costs are not included.

KCC is committed to providing its varsity teams with resources that enable an equitable quality of experience for men and women. In some sports, in which the basic rules and nature of the sport are similar for both genders, the overall resources required to provide equitable experiences for male and female student-athletes are very similar for both teams. In other sports, basic differences necessitate larger budgets for one gender than the other.

For team travel, KCC's Athletic Department uses a standard "per Diem" allowance for lodging and meals to ensure equitable treatment of all athletes. Therefore, differences in travel expenditures are primarily a reflection of differences in squad size and schedule length, both of which are governed by NJCAA and MCCAA league regulations.

It should also be noted that each team's expenditures fluctuate significantly from one year to the next, due to variations in home-and-away schedules, southern training trips, qualifications for post-season championships, and large equipment and uniform purchases that are made on a rotating or need basis every few years.
