Welcome to Kellogg Community College's Nursing Program!

Registered Nurses (RNs) are health professionals who serve individuals, families and communities with actual or potential health care needs. They are leaders, communicators, advocates, educators and care providers in the management of actual and/or potential health problems.

KCC's Nursing Program is "laddered," consisting of Level I and Level II courses. Upon successful completion of Level I, a Practical Nursing Certificate may be awarded and graduates are eligible to take the PN-NCLEX licensure exam, if they choose. Students who continue and successfully complete Level II courses will be awarded an Associate of Applied Science degree in Nursing and are eligible to take the RN-NCLEX licensure exam.

KCC's Nursing Program is offered in full-time and part-time options.

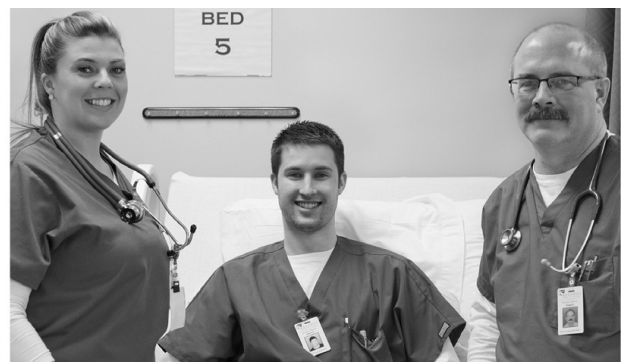
Once in the program, the full-time option takes four semesters to complete. The part-time option takes seven continuous semesters to complete. We even offer a part-time (nights and weekends) program option. Class and clinicals can occur during day and evening hours for both the full-time and part-time programs, depending upon the schedule.

An Advanced Placement program option is available for current LPNs who are seeking to complete Level II coursework, earn an Associate in Applied Science degree in Nursing, and be eligible for the RN-NCLEX. (Please see Nursing LPN to RN Advanced Placement Admission Packet.)



Important to Note

- *Future employers may require proof of high school or GED completion as an employment requirement.*
- *Students accepted into the Nursing program are required to undergo a physical examination, immunizations, a drug screen and criminal background check. Individuals concerned whether any court judgments against him or her would likely result in a denial of a license may obtain a preliminary determination from the state of Michigan's Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA). Nursing Admission Requirements

Non-Course Requirements

- **Official transcripts from high school and all accredited colleges and universities previously attended.** Current and up-to-date transcripts are required. Institutions attended will be compared to a national database and includes those attended while participating in a dual enrollment or early college program. For schools attended more than 10 years ago, please speak with Academic Advising.
- **Grade point average of 2.5 or higher from all accredited colleges attended.**
- **18 years of age at the start of Nursing program.** (Clinical education partners may require students to be 18 years of age to participate in clinical learning experiences.)

Course and Testing Requirements

- **Biology Requirements: BIOL 201 (Human Anatomy) and BIOL 202 (Human Physiology)**
Biology 201 and Biology 202 must be completed with a grade of B- (2.67) or higher in order to be considered an applicant to KCC's Nursing program. This course requirement must be completed in no more than two attempts in order for an applicant to be eligible to apply. Any earned grade, including "W" or incomplete are considered as attempts. This includes attempts completed at KCC and all previous institutions. Course attempts completed within six years prior to the program start date will be considered for admission. Course attempts greater than six years old will not be counted as an attempt.
- **Mathematics requirements:** ACCUPLACER® Quantitative Reasoning score of 250 or higher, or PSAT/SAT Mathematics score of 25 or higher, or ALEKS Mathematics score of 46 or higher, or MATH 101, 102, or higher with a grade of B- (2.67) or higher in no more than two attempts, within six years prior to the program start date.
- **Kaplan Admission Test**
The Kaplan Admission Test is a free tool used to assess the academic skills necessary for the Nursing program. The Admission Test is a 91-question, online, multiple-choice, timed test that evaluates the basic reading, math, writing and science skills of students seeking entry into a nursing program leading to RN licensure.

Students must have their admission requirements for the Nursing program completed or be registered for the last semester of their admission requirements in order to register for the Kaplan Admission Test, which is offered and administered at Kellogg Community College. Students are permitted to take the Kaplan Nursing Admission Test once per year. Test retakes are prohibited unless a full calendar year has passed since the date of the initial test. Students' Kaplan scores are valid for two years; afterwards, students must retake the Kaplan. The minimum overall (cumulative) rounded score of 54% or higher, within two years prior to the Nursing program application deadline date, must be achieved to meet admission requirements.

How to Apply

The Admissions office is accepting applications from March 3, 2025 to May 22, 2025 for the Fall 2025 Full-time Nursing program and Fall 2025 Part-time Nights and Weekends Nursing program. Applications for the Spring 2026 Part-time Nursing program will be accepted June 2, 2025 to August 15, 2025. If you have completed all of the admission requirements listed in this packet, you may submit an application to the Nursing program at kellogg.edu/nursing-admissions. If you have not yet completed all of the necessary admission requirements but would like to begin working on them at KCC, please submit a General Application to KCC at apply.kellogg.edu, select Nursing as your Academic Program and meet with an Academic Advisor early in the process.

Admission Request for Consideration

KCC's Admissions office recognizes that students may experience special circumstances beyond their control that may impact their academic success. Students may submit a Request for Consideration for extenuating circumstances that contributed to their inability to meet admission requirements. All decisions are made in the best interest of the student and aim to ensure the integrity of program requirements. Students may exclude transcripts from other institutions if the coursework is 10 years or older. *Students who believe they are eligible for this Request for Consideration or Grade Amnesty can contact Admissions or Academic Advising to obtain this form.*

Acceptance of Position

Once admissions decisions have been finalized, all accepted students will receive a letter of admission to the Nursing program as well as a packet of information to begin the onboarding process. This packet includes directions on how to formally accept the position being offered. Also included are a timeline of important dates, background check information, vaccination requirements and more. Students who are not able to complete all post-acceptance steps by the time specified may lose their seat in the Nursing program.

- SOCI 201 (*Introduction to Sociology*)
- PSYC 201 (*Introduction to Psychology*)
- *ENGL 151 or ENGL 152 (*Freshman Composition*)
- *PSYC 220 (*Developmental Psychology*)
- FYS 101 (*First Year Seminar; see Academic Advisor to determine if you will be required to complete this course*)

* Denotes competitive application points for the Nursing program. A student can receive points for this additional coursework OR they can receive points for having a college degree from an accredited institution.

Reverse Transfer

Students who have completed a baccalaureate or higher degree from an accredited institution may be considered for reverse transfer to meet the general education requirements for an Associate in Applied Science degree at KCC. The determination of which courses are to be considered in reverse transfer is at the discretion of the program director. This policy does not release the student from meeting program specific requirements or graduation requirements.

Students who have a baccalaureate and/or masters degree and wish to be considered for reverse transfer credit should email the Director of Nursing Education during the first semester of the nursing program. The following courses may be eligible for reverse transfer credit if they did not directly transfer into KCC: ENGL 151, PSYC 201, PSYC 220, and SOCI 201.

Advising Notes

- Meet early and often with an Academic Advisor after submitting KCC's General Application and college transcripts, but prior to submitting the Nursing Application, to review course specific requirements and transfer equivalences.
- Transfer transcripts should be on file and evaluated by KCC's Registrar's office before meeting with an Academic Advisor to get the most out of your appointment. Please note that it can take a maximum of two weeks for in-state transcripts and four weeks for out-of-state transcripts to be evaluated.

(for students who have **previously or are currently** attending other colleges or universities)

 - Official transcripts from all accredited colleges/universities must reflect up-to-date completed coursework
 - Institutions attended will be compared to a national database and includes those attended while participating in dual enrollment or early college program
 - Transcripts older than 10 years from the start of the nursing program are not required, however, if a student has already submitted the transcript(s), the grades cannot be removed from consideration.
- Grade point average of 2.5 or higher from each accredited college/university**
- Biology course requirements**
Course requirements must be completed with:
 1. Grade of a B- (2.67) or higher
 2. No more than two attempts
 3. Within six years prior to the start of the program
