CRITICAL CARE EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT PROGRAM



Kellogg Community College is partnering with the University of Maryland, Baltimore to bring you the nationally recognized Critical Care Emergency Medical Transport program.

The CCEMTP is the only nationally recognized course endorsed by the National Association of EMS educators designed to prepare the experienced paramedic, nurse or respiratory technician to become a critical care transport specialist.

This 112 hour intensive course which meets once a week for fourteen weeks from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, will cover a wide variety of topics including ventilators, 12 lead ecg's, iv pumps, invasive lines, advanced pharmacology, hemodynamic monitoring, intra-aortic balloon pumps and complications of transport. Lectures will cover illness and injuries that require inter-facility transport related to respiratory, cardiovascular, trauma, neurological, heme/immunology, renal, and gastrointestinal considerations.

This course is CECBEMS approved for CE credits continuing education credits. Credits will be issued on an hour for hour basis through Kellogg Community College and the National Registry. State licensing credits will also be issued. College credit is granted upon successful course completion.

ATTENDEES

The CCEMTP course is open to any paramedic, nurse, or registered respiratory therapist who has worked in that capacity for at least one year. Current recognition in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) or PEPP, and a nationally recognized trauma course such as BTLS, PHTLS, or TNCC is highly recommended.

FACULTY

The course faculty is made up of paramedics, nurses, and physicians with extensive experience in critical care. All instructors are approved by Kellogg Community College Emergency Medical Services department and the University of Maryland Baltimore County Department of Emergency Health Services.

Class size limited to 24. Kellogg Community College reserves the right to cancel any course due to insufficient enrollment. Tuition may be refunded or transferred to another course date.
